The Cherry Creek School District covers 108 square miles and serves nearly 50,000 students who attend classes in 60 different facilities. To ensure that all students experience the same high quality curriculum and instruction, the district has developed a **Guaranteed and Viable Curriculum (GVC)**. The GVC guarantees that certain content will be taught by all counselors/teachers in all schools and is viable in that all counselors/teachers can adequately address the guaranteed content in the instructional time available to them. Essential benchmarks have been developed, which indicate what all students should know and be able to do in each core content area in order to be prepared and successful in post-secondary options and in life. The counseling benchmarks are divided by grade level.

The mission of OHS counselors is to prepare ALL students to be career/college ready by providing students with the tools to plan a meaningful course of study, assisting students to academically achieve, and helping them grow and develop as lifelong learners.

Each student is supported in:

Academics- to acquire academic behaviors and strategies for success in key content areas, with an emphasis on literacy skills and algebraic concepts and financial planning awareness

College/Career Readiness- to explore and develop post high school goals, create and maintain an ICAP, and understand college entrance and costs

Personal/Social Growth- to gain knowledge and develop interconnected interpersonal skills, and to understand and respect oneself and others
